 - i. Things to consider:
 - 1. Inflation, need, wage, demographics, how large the scope is
 - ii. Priorities:
 - 1. Food, supplies, wages
 - iii. Important points to keep in mind:
 - 1. Interest rates are increasing \rightarrow
 - 2. Commute costs 个
 - 3. Housing costs \uparrow
- III. Committee Updates
 - a. Strategic Planning
 - Budget Line Item: based on current budget line amount, how much do you think you will need for AY 22/23?
 Should the amount total for budget line stay the same or change and why:
 - i. Financial Wellness Program
 - 1. AY 21/22: \$22,669
 - Increased utilization by graduate students; need to expand services

- 3. Financial Wellness Center is open during the summer
 - a. Need for in-person staffing
 - b. Down 1 staff member during AY
 - c. Funding to hire 1 more graduate student
- ii. Economic Crisis Response Team (ECRT) Meal Voucher Program
 - 1. AY 21/22: \$35,000
 - 2. AY 21/22 allocation should be minimum, would advocate for an increase:
 - a. Need more funding to support increase of meal plan from 11 to 19
 - b. Increased Swipe Out Hunger donation towards meal vouchers
 - c. Keep budget line amount the same (suggested modest \$5,000 increase)
- iii. Meal Plan Conversion 11 to 14
 - 1. AY 21/22: \$35,000
 - Recommendation: ECRT to determine budget required to accommodate conversion from 11 OR 14 to 19 Meal Plan (see previous section on ECRT)
- iv. New Student Admit Food Justice Program
 - 1. AY 21/22: \$30,000
 - 2. Budget would need to account for inflation increase
- v. Fitness Improvement Training through Exercise and Diet [FITTED] Eats:
 - 1. AY 21/22: \$7,650
 - Points to consider → inflation impact, rising cost of food, supplies, and transportation on services
 - a. Russell's recommendation: will make the current line amount work for AY 22/23
- vi. Food Box Giveaways

1. AY 21/22: \$120,000

- 2. Keep budget line amount the same, but increase to reflect inflation
- vii. Community Programs Office (CPO) Food Closet

1. AY 21/22: \$112,524

- 2. Make the current/suggested budget line amount work
- viii. Grocery Bundle Program

1. AY 21/22: \$10,000

- 2. Make the current/suggested budget line amount work
- ix. Food Justice Bruin Bites

1. AY 21/22: \$30,000

- 2. Keep budget line amount the same, but increase to reflect inflation
- x. Student Group Events

1. AY 21/22: \$100,000

- 2. Keep the same
- xi. Bruin Meals Program

1. AY 21/22: \$30,000

- 2. Keep the same
- xii. Financial Aid Grants

1. AY 21/22: \$280,000

- 2. With federal relief programs phasing out, allocation must remain the same
- xiii. Basic Needs Initiative Fund

1. AY 21/22: \$30,000

- 2. Keep the same
- xiv. HCI Special Sessions for Teaching Kitchen

1. AY 21/22: \$2,000

- 2. Need feedback from AVP Slusser
- xv. Commuter Support Services (Rapid Re-Housing Funds)
 - 1. AY 21/22: \$75,000

- 2. Recommendation: 35% should be reallocated for Housing
 - a. Reallocation=\$26,250
 - i. 50% \rightarrow Emergency Housing
 - ECRT recommends new line item just for "Emergency Housing"
 - ii. 50% \rightarrow Housing Grants
- 3. Remaining 65% could be reallocated for the CPO Commuter Van Service to account for rising cost of gas
- xvi. Housing Grants (Rapid Re-Housing Funds)

1. AY 21/22: \$242,000

- 2. Keep the same
- 3. See previous section for additional notes
- xvii. Bruin Hub Development Project Completion (Rapid Re-Housing Funds)

1. AY 21/22: \$50,000

- 2. Need to circle back—could be reallocated to areas below
- xviii. Commuter Van Service (Rapid Re-Housing Funds)

1. AY 21/22: \$40,000

- 2. Things to consider→rising gas prices, need to increase wages for student employees
- 3. Recommendation \rightarrow increase in funding
- xix. 580 Cafe Equipment

1. AY 21/22: \$3,000

- 2. Keep the same
- xx. HCI Garden Project Student Plots

1. AY 21/22: \$5,000

- a. Money is currently used for educational programming
- 2. Keep the same
- xxi. Teaching Kitchen

1. AY 21/22: \$15,000

- 2. Keep the same, but slight increase to reflect inflation
- xxii. Professional Staffing

1. AY 21/22: \$368,157

- 2. Cost needs to go up approx. \$10,000 for the Financial Wellness Program
 - a. Requesting additional graduate student+ professional staff
- 3. ECRT proposes to add additional staff due to high student demand
- xxiii. Basic Needs Student Employment

1. AY 21/22: \$100,000

- 2. Things to consider:
 - a. Increase in labor demand
 - b. There's a need to hire more Basic Needs Coordinators
- 3. Can keep funds the same, but if possible, requesting a slight increase
- xxiv. UCLA Basic Needs Committee CA Higher Education Basic Needs Alliance (CHEBNA)
